David Brearley High School students are forward-thinking and enthusiastic about discovering and developing their passions. Our small size allows individualized student support and freedom for instructional creativity. We provide a strong foundation in core subjects but also teach modern skills that prepare students to contribute to the world. Students are engaged in their community as well as popular extracurricular activities that include Bears that Care, Race Matters Alliance, and Esports.

Our students' progressive values are reflected in awards they have received, including the Princeton Prize in Race Relations and the Marc Wesley Hardy Human Rights Award. Multiple students in each graduating class earn the State Seal of Biliteracy.

The DBHS Counseling Department guides students toward their next steps based on their unique strengths and abilities; our most recent graduate survey indicates only 3 percent were "undecided" on their post-high school path.

David Brearley High School is Union County's Choice School and has students attending from the Kenilworth, Elizabeth, Hillside, Linden, Plainfield, Rahway, Roselle, Roselle Park, Union, and Winfield Park communities. As part of the Choice School program, gifted students can apply to the Scholars' Academy.

## CURRICULUM

David Brearley High School offers academic classes and electives that encourage innovation and exploration. Courses include Advanced Placement (AP) Seminar, AP Pre-Calculus, Esports, Digital Sound Engineering, Statistics, Public Speaking and Exploring Colleges and Careers. Elective subjects are offered in Business; Performing, Visual and Fine Arts; Computer Science and Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM).

The schedule for the instructional day is divided into nine, 46-minute periods.

Students are required to successfully complete:

- Four years of English
- Four years of Physical Education
- Three years of Mathematics
- Three years of Science
- Three years of Electives
- Two years of United States History
- One year of Global Studies
- One year of a Fine or Performing Art
- One year of a 21st Century & Career course
- One year of a World Language
- 1/2 year Financial Literacy
